As a congregation, we took a big step toward calling our next pastor by approving a Call Committee at the special congregational meeting on Sunday, March 23.

Thank you to the following members for serving on this committee: Ashley Skorseth (*Transition Team*), Nick Nicklow, Jane Kujala, Bob Walker, Lauren Simensen, Kate Cheney (*Youth member*), and Laurin Glass (*Youth alternate*).

Committee members will be meeting with Deacon Susan Williams from the Northeastern Minnesota Synod and start working on the Ministry Site Profile (*MSP*) using information gathered by the Transition Team.

We do not know how long the call process will take but we ask that you keep Call Committee members in your prayers and offer them encouragement as they prepare for this work.

Sewing Machines for Refugees

I was in Uganda in Africa and was with the women who have formed a new cooperative with the sewing machines that were purchased with the noisy offering collected in December.

Mary Garang said, "I never thought I would be able to learn to sew, or that I could earn money doing it. I have four children to take care of on my own. My husband was killed in the civil war. I could never afford to send all of my children to school. But, now I will be able to do that."

At worship in the refugee camp, I had the opportunity to speak. I shared Trinity's generosity that resulted in the purchase of these additional sewing machines.

The worship broke out in a song of praise for you and your goodness.

Update from TLC's Transition Team

Thank you to everyone who participated in the paper copy questionnaire! Forty-six written responses were turned in as well as four community responses.

Next Steps: You are all invited to join the Transition Team in the Fellowship Hall following the Palm Sunday worship service on **April 13**. The Team will share its synopsis of the questionnaire along with leading a fun inter-generational exercise in order to continue narrowing down the top ministry skills Trinity is seeking out in calling our next pastor.

Of the forty possible ministry task boxes to choose from, you were asked to limit it to five choices. It is often hard to choose and some tasks can overlap!

The Top Five responses were:

- # 1 - *Preaching/Worship (38);*
- # 2 - *Youth & Family Ministry (27);*
- # 3 - *Pastoral Care/Visitation (22);*
- # 4 - *Building a Sense of Community (14);*

and, there was a tie for

- # 5 - *Children's Ministry (11)*
- *Ministry in Daily Life (11).*



There were a number of other ministry tasks that were very close in numbers to the top five boxes being checked. Those additional ministry tasks are what we hope to clarify with your help and conversation on April 13.

As the newly formed Call Committee begins their work soon, they will be encouraged by your participation and your input in this process! The Call Committee will utilize this information as well as have the opportunity to expand on those choices in the paperwork they will fill out. In other words, Trinity is not limited to only five. Your participation will greatly assist them in their important work to prepare a Ministry Site Profile in order for a pastoral search to begin.

Wrapped in Love

“⁴ Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant ⁵ or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable; it keeps no record of wrongs; ⁶ it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. ⁷ It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. ⁸ Love never ends. “ - 1 Cor. 13:4-8a

During Bible Quest on Wednesdays, we talk a lot about love and what it means to love. About God’s love. About Agape love. What love is and what love is not. About the action of love and how we live out that love in the world. That love is something we do. And we practice love with one another.

Paul reminded the Corinthians that love never ends and that God’s love never ends. In February we began making a Love Quilt with Norma Thomas’ guidance. Norma purchased the beautiful fabric and cut it into squares for the kids to draw on with fabric markers. The kids were each given a piece of fabric and asked to draw symbols or images that show love on them. Images that express how we love one another. Images that express how God loves us.

As the children drew on their squares, I watched as the adults and older youth surrounded them and supported them. Not by telling them what to draw, but by being with them. By sitting with them. By encouraging them. By loving them. And I see this every time our adults and children/youth are together. And the children/youth show love back.

Norma sewed all of the love squares into a beautiful quilt and The Love Quilt is now hanging on the wall in the Fellowship Hall near the children’s play area. The Love Quilt will hang there for a while as a reminder of how we should love and then, one day, we will give it away as a sign of love.

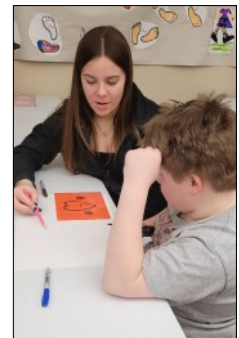
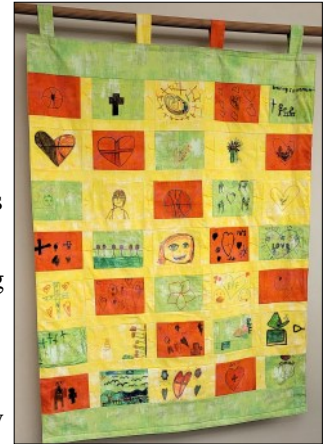

Newborn Kits for Global Health Ministries

We are helping Global Health Ministries reach their goal of 10,000 Newborn Kits

Please follow these directions carefully, and make sure any used items are in excellent (like new) condition.

- 1 regular-sized bath towel, lightweight, Approx. 50" x 26"
- 1 washcloth (please not microfiber)
- 1 bath-size bar of white Ivory soap in original packaging
- 1 newborn cotton t-shirt or "onesie" - size 0-3 or newborn - No need to cut off bottom of onesie
- 1 newborn stocking hat - Size small, a newborn's head is about 14" in circumference
- 1 baby receiving blanket, between 30" x 30" and 48" x 48" - Soft cotton or medium weight flannel
- 2 cloth prefolded diapers - Cotton with reinforced center panel, minimum size 12" x 16"
- 2 diaper pins - Please no safety pins - Pin diaper pins to diapers

To assemble your kits:

- Lay items on center of towel, fold and roll (like a burrito!)
- Place towel bundle in a pillowcase if available, or tie bundle securely with strips of cloth, ribbons or twine

Finding Joy in All Times: A Guide from Our Mental Health & Wellness Team

After a busy and stressful first few months of the year, our Mental Health and Wellness team took a step back to rest, reflect, and reassess our approach to these articles. We recognized the importance of giving ourselves the same care and grace that we encourage in others. With that in mind, we've decided to move to a quarterly focus—choosing one topic every few months to explore in depth. As we considered where to begin, we felt drawn to the theme of joy—not just as an emotion, but as a source of strength, especially in difficult seasons.

In life, we all experience seasons of difficulty—whether it's personal struggles, loss, uncertainty, or the weight of the world around us. During these times, joy can feel elusive, as if it's something that comes and goes with our circumstances. However, biblical joy is much deeper than fleeting happiness; it is a state of the heart rooted in our relationship with God.

Defining Joy: More Than Just Happiness

Joy is often confused with happiness, but they are not the same. Happiness depends on external circumstances—when things go well, we feel happy. Joy, on the other hand, is an internal assurance and peace that remains despite our circumstances. In Galatians 5:22, joy is listed as a fruit of the Spirit, meaning it is something that God cultivates within us rather than something we must manufacture on our own.

Why Joy Matters for Mental and Emotional Well-Being

Joy is not just a spiritual concept; it profoundly impacts mental and emotional health. Studies show that people who cultivate joy experience lower stress levels, better relationships, and greater resilience. Proverbs 17:22 tells us, "A joyful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones." Joy strengthens us from the inside out, helping us navigate life's challenges with hope and perseverance.

How to Remain Joyful in All Seasons of Life:

1. Stay Rooted in God's Presence

True joy comes from being connected to God. Regular prayer, worship, and Scripture reading help us stay anchored in God's presence, where joy is abundant.

2. Practice Gratitude

Gratitude shifts our focus from what is wrong to what is good. Even in difficult times, there is always something to be thankful for.

3. Lean on Community

We were never meant to go through life alone. Being in a supportive church community allows us to share our burdens, receive encouragement, and find joy in fellowship.

4. Choose to Rejoice, Even When It's Hard

Joy is often an intentional choice. In Habakkuk 3:17-18, the prophet declares that even if everything is lost, he will still rejoice in the Lord. This kind of joy is not based on circumstances but on faith in God's goodness.

5. Serve Others

Sometimes, the best way to find joy is to help someone else. Serving others shifts our focus outward and brings deep, lasting fulfillment.

6. Hold on to God's Promises

When life feels overwhelming, we can cling to God's promises. Romans 15:13 reminds us, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him." God's faithfulness gives us reason to rejoice, even when life is uncertain.

Final Encouragement

Joy is not about denying pain or hardship but about holding onto the unshakable truth that God is with us. No matter what we face, joy remains available to us because it is anchored in God. May we continue to walk in the fullness of joy that only God can provide, even in the hardest of times.

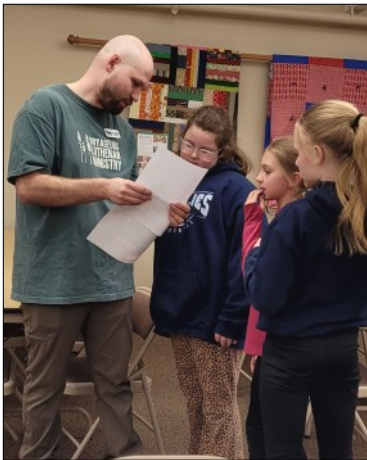


Fun for All Ages

Jim and daughters supplied the dough and other ingredients so that those attending were able to make & take fresh product home at the end of the day.

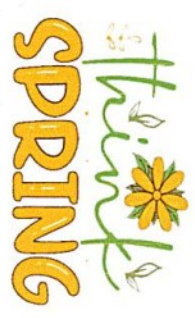
It was a fun-filled multi-generational morning attended and enjoyed by several of the Trinity family. There were even some available for fellowship time the next morning! Yummy!

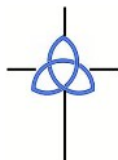
